Mr. Delano Stewart Marlow, 85, of Royston, GA passed away on Sunday, June 14, 2020, at the St. Mary's Hospice House in Watkinsville, GA.

Mr. Marlow was born in Royston, GA on July 31, 1934, son of the late Thomas William Marlow and the late Carrie Bryant Marlow. He was an educator and coach having worked in the Franklin County, Commerce and Banks County School Systems.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his brothers, Arnold Marlow and Jones Marlow.
