Mr. Donald Kimsey Hall, 70, of Bowman, GA passed away on Wednesday, February 20, 2019 at his home.

Mr. Hall was born in High Point, NC on January 6, 1949, son of the late Rufus Kimsey and Annie Evans Hall. He retired from the U.S. Army with the rank of E8 Master Sergeant after 26 years of service. He served during the Vietnam War, Operations Desert Storm and Desert Shield where he received the Bronze Star and Purple Heart.
