Mr. James W. Bolmon, Jr., 89, of Royston, GA went to be with the Lord on February 6, 2020. He was at Brown Health and Rehabilitation Center in Royston.

Mr. Bolmon was born in Madison County, GA on October 8, 1930. He was a Korean War Veteran; served proudly and was awarded several medals. He was self-employed and ran a service station for many years, retired from the City of Royston Police Department after twenty years of serving the community, a certified EMT and the assistant director when the ambulance service was run by the city, served on the city Fire Department and was assigned to be in charge of the city gym. After retirement he enjoyed repairing lawn mowers, gardening and growing watermelons.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife of 62 years, Evelyn Joyce Martin Bolmon.

Survivors include his daughter, Debra Mauldin of Lavonia, GA; grandchildren, Christie Haselden and Andrew Mauldin; and two great grandchildren.

A private family service with military honors was held at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, February 8, 2020, in the Franklin Memorial Gardens- South in Royston.
