



Dr. Kirk Fernando Hartsfield

July 20, 1930 - June 14, 2014

Dr. Kirk Fernando Hartsfield, age 83, of 12 Cobb Village Drive, Box 35 Royston, GA passed away June 14 after a brief stay at Brown Health and Rehabilitation. Dr. Hartsfield was also a longtime resident of Franklin Springs, GA.

Kirk Hartsfield was born in Quincy, FL July 1930 to Fernando Lewis Hartsfield and Eva Kirk Hartsfield. In 1948, he enrolled at Emmanuel College in Franklin Springs, GA where he met Nellie Ruth Holliday (Nelle) from Belton, SC. They were married in 1953. Following his father's death, Kirk and Nelle returned to Florida where he operated the family business, which included two grocery stores, frozen food lockers, a grist mill, and a feed business.

Kirk and Nelle returned to Emmanuel College in 1959. From that point forward, Kirk Hartsfield's life was inextricably interwoven with Emmanuel College. Over the next 36 years, he held a number of key leadership positions at Emmanuel, including Dean of Men, Dean of Students, Instructor, Academic Dean, and Vice President for Academic Affairs. Kirk Hartsfield's love for Emmanuel, his uncompromising work ethic, and his absolute devotion to Jesus Christ have left an indelible mark on Emmanuel College and the ongoing Kingdom work of that institution.

Kirk Hartsfield was also active in his local church and the Gideons. He was

one of the first laymen to be appointed to the General Board of Administration of the International Pentecostal Holiness Church. He was active in civic affairs, serving on the Franklin Springs City Counsel and for 30 years on the Franklin Springs Volunteer Fire Department.

Following completion of his associates degree at Emmanuel College, Kirk completed his baccalaureate at Florida State University, and his master's and doctorate at the University of Georgia. His exemplary academic record in all his graduate studies earned him election into multiple honor societies, including Phi Delta Kappa, Kappa Delta Pi, and Phi Kappa Phi.

He is survived by his loving and forever devoted wife, Nelle. She has been his faithful and dedicated help meet for over 61 years. Kirk and Nelle have been inseparable, holding strong to their vows of "til death do us part." Kirk Hartsfield is survived by two children; Sharon Ruth Atkinson and husband Rev. Tony Atkinson of Roanoke, VA, and Dr. Michael Kirk Hartsfield and wife Christine of Virginia Beach, VA. He is also survived by four granddaughters; Melanie Wayne, Melissa Oshoniyi, Lauren Hartsfield, Jessica Hartsfield, and five great grandchildren; Allie Wayne, Josiah Wayne, Cayden Wayne, Asher Wayne, and Jaelyn Oshoniyi. He was predeceased by his parents Fernando and Eva Hartsfield, and his sister Lois and her husband Johnny.

The family will receive friends from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. on Sunday evening, June 15, 2014 at Pruitt Funeral Home in Royston, Georgia. Funeral services will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Monday, June 16, 2014 at the Franklin Springs Pentecostal Holiness Church with Dr. Earl Beatty, Dr. David Hopkins, and Reverend Harrison Lampley presiding. The body will lie in state at the church from 10:30 a.m. until the funeral hour. Interment will follow immediately at the Franklin Springs Cemetery.
