Mrs. Evangeline Sue Carey Carr, 91, of Franklin Springs, GA passed away on Wednesday, April 7, 2021, at the St. Mary's Hospice House in Watkinsville, GA.

Mrs. Carr was born in Anderson, SC on November 13, 1929, daughter of the late Joseph Lee Carey and the late Bertha Mae Chastain Carey. She was a school teacher having retired from the Franklin County School System and was a member of the Peniel Pentecostal Holiness Church.

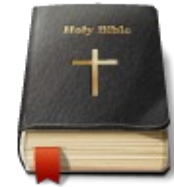

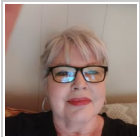
