Mrs. Willie Mae Hall Ayers, 93, of Royston, GA passed away on Monday, January 30, 2017, at the Brown Health & Rehabilitation Center in Royston, GA.

Mrs. Ayers was born in Royston, GA on October 17, 1923, daughter of the late Carl W. Hall and the late Myrtle Cromer Hall. She attended Emmanuel College, Athens Tech, and Clarke County School of Business. Mrs. Ayers worked as a welder during World War II, worked in the Personnel Department for Johnson & Johnson, and was appointed as acting Sheriff after the passing of her husband, Sheriff Dan W. Ayers. Mrs. Ayers was a member of the Royston Baptist Church, Agape Sunday School Class, RBC Women's Missionary Union and the Johnson & Johnson Retiree Club.

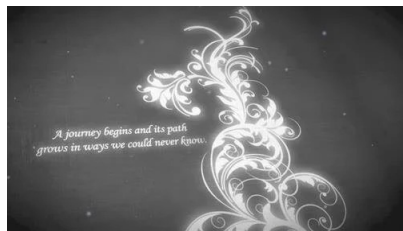

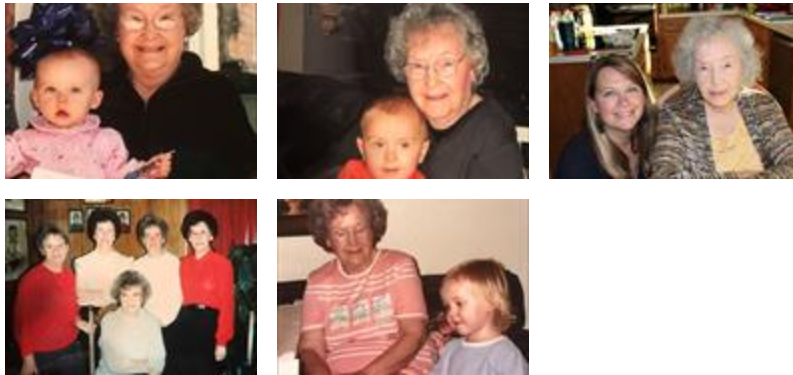

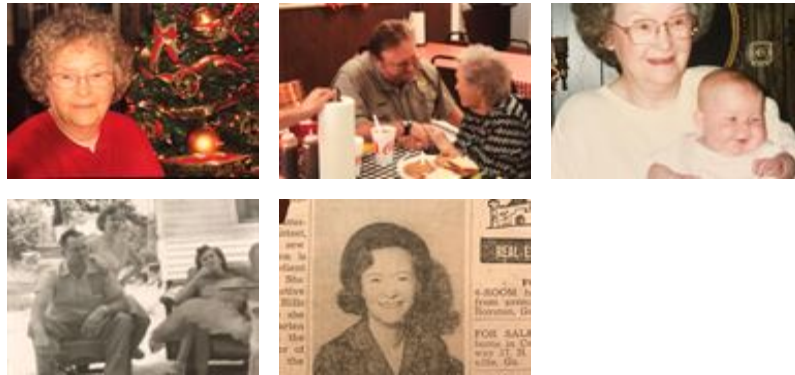
